

Frequently Asked Questions

When can I come?

Midweek stays are usually 2 or 3 nights from Tuesday - Thursday.
from 3pm on the day of arrival until 3pm on the day of departure.

Weekends: Friday - Sunday (2 nights) from 3pm Friday to 3pm Sunday

Long Weekends: Friday - Monday (3 nights) from 3pm Friday to 3pm Monday

Week: Friday - Thursday (6 nights) 3pm Friday to 3pm Thursday

What's included:

The yurt has a double bed, duvet, pillows and blanket. All bedding is provided.
A two-ring gas cooker for cooking indoors, a fire pit and outside cooking utensils.
Table and chairs, rechargeable lanterns and candle lanterns.
A wood burning stove keeps the yurt warm and cosy if its chilly and a basket of logs is provided in the yurt on arrival.
Apple juice and Cider made on the farm is part of your welcome pack. More can be purchased on arrival.
There is access to a fridge to store your groceries in and cold water and a sink for washing up. These are a short walk across the yard away from the yurt. Tea towels and washing up liquid is provided.
Showers and toilets are available in the main bunkhouse, this is a short walk across the yard, away from the yurt. The hot water for the showers is heated by solar panels or our wood-fired boiler.

What to Bring:

A torch or two, the lighting provided in the yurt is low level so if you want to read bring stronger torches
Towels
Groceries (None are provided but organic meat and vegetables can be ordered from Crooked End Farm (www.crookedend.co.uk) in the neighbouring village.
BBQ and charcoal if you don't want to have a go at the tripod open-fire cooking
Flip-flops or wellies, sunscreen and wet weather gear
We ask people not to wear outdoor shoes in the yurt so you may like to bring a pair of slippers or thick socks

What Not to Bring:

Sorry pets are not allowed on site so please don't bring any animals or pets with you to the farm
Please don't bring anything to play amplified music on/with.

Mobile Technology

Will I have Mobile Phone coverage?

The farm has patchy mobile phone coverage and it varies by network provider.
Orange and Vodaphone service is good the others are less reliable and you may need to walk up the lane or across the field to get a good signal.

Is there Internet Access?

There is wi-fi access around the farm yard but not at the yurt.

There are no electrical points. The yurt is the perfect place to stay and have a break from your day to day life and demands.
